- B. Many American children grow up in poor families with few close adults to provide them with emotional support and guidance. These children often fail in school and are likely to get involved in crimes. However, their lives can be changed through the aid from society.
- Many research studies have shown that if children develop a closer relationship with caring adults, they deal with problems much better. Therefore, many schools and community organizations have started mentoring programs in an effort to help at-risk children. The volunteers in these programs are called mentors; these mentors develop positive relationships with at-risk children and help them gain confidence in themselves.
- Mentors help children find happiness and gain important social skills. For instance, children take pleasure in doing fun activities, such as playing games and making things, with the mentors. They also

feel less stressful and depressed after sharing sorrows with the mentors. On the other hand, the mentors act as role models. They teach the children how to get along with others and how to behave properly. Most important of all, children gain a sense of safety that helps them regain confidence in themselves and trust in adults.

So far, these mentoring programs have helped millions of at-risk children. Mentors not only help these children become better persons later but also make society a better place.

C. English has more words than any other language. Why is this? One reason is that English borrows words from many other languages. Then it turns these words into new English words. Many of these words come from Greek and Latin. These are called roots. By studying roots, a person can learn the meanings of many different words in English.

For instance, the root *hydro* comes from Greek. It means "water." From that root, we get the words hydrate, dehydrate, hydrogen, and many others. The root *aster* comes from Greek. It means "star." From *aster*, we get the words asteroid, asterisk, astronomy, astronaut, and many others. *Geo* also comes from the Greek. It means "earth." The words geology, geometry, and geography all come from it.

Of course, there are many roots from Latin, too. For instance, the root *vid* means to "see." From that root, we get video, visual, visualize, and many others. The root *script* means to "write." From it, we get transcript, inscription, and others. And *port* means to "carry." From that root, we get transport, portable, export, and import, among others.

Without borrowing from other languages, English would have very few words. But, thanks to Latin and Greek--and other languages, too,--English has many, many words.

D. Some hospital doctors send an assistant rather than come themselves to talk with patients after an operation. Other patients wait in vain for visits from doctors who simply forget to come. When some doctors come to examine a patient in a semi-private room or in a ward, they don't even take the seconds needed to draw the privacy curtains around the bed. Some doctors are so *callous* that they ask personal questions in front of visitors. For example, as my boss sat in a chair nearby, I was asked by my doctor when I had my last menstrual period. And there are doctors who, without getting the patient's permission, bring classes of medical students who gather around the patient's bed. They then discuss the patient's case as if she or he were a medical specimen or a corpse lying there not hearing a word being said.

Some people say that because hospitals are so overcrowded with patients, doctors must use their time as efficiently as possible. Others say that doctors are so busy making money that they don't want to take time to spend with patients. But no matter how busy doctors are, it is important for them to show human sensitivity.
