When it comes to eating, more Americans are ordering in instead of eating out. In some restaurants, cooks make food for other online restaurants at the same time. To take one example, the cooks make pizza at Frato's Pizza in Chicago, and they also make chicken, salmon, and even frozen milk drinks—all of which can only be ordered online.

Frato's owner, Michael Kudrna, launched the online-only business in 2019 to keep up with the new eating trends. He says one third of his sales come from people using third-party apps on their cell phones. But third-party apps can charge as much as 30 percent to manage the ordering and delivering of the food.

The increase in online ordering in the U.S. has created openings for new kinds of businesses. For example, Kitchen United builds kitchens for restaurants that want to enter delivery or take-out markets. Grubhub and Uber Eats help small businesses compete. Both businesses reach out to restaurant owners with their **virtual restaurant** programs, making suggestions based on the data collected from customer searches. Their programs help owners think about everything from how people get their good to what should go on the menu.

Virtual restaurants have the benefit of testing new ideas without taking on expensive leases or employing more workers. But small restaurants should look at the risks before starting an online restaurant suggested by Grubhub and Uber Eats, which offer no training for kitchen staff to make new foods. Rick Carmac, dean of the Institute of Culinary Education in New York, offered two things for small restaurants to consider: whether delivery containers are right for new dishes, or whether they want to increase their dependence on outside delivery drivers. Every time you're online, you are **bombarded** by pictures, articles, links and videos trying to tell their story. Unfortunately, not all of these stories are true. These stories circulate quickly, and the result is ... fake news. Experts in media studies and online psychology have been examining the fake news phenomenon. Read these tips, and don't get fooled!

1. Check the source

Look at the website where the story comes from. Does it look real? Is the text well written? Are there a variety of other stories or is it just one story? Fake news websites often use addresses that sound like real newspapers, but don't have many real stories about other topics.

2. Watch out for fake photos

Many fake news stories use images that are Photoshopped or taken from an unrelated site. Sometimes, if you just look closely at an image, you can see if it has been changed. Or use a tool like Google Reverse Image search. It will show you if the same image has been used in other contexts.

3. Check if the story is in other places

Look to see if the story you are reading is on other news sites that you know and trust. If you do find it on many other sites, then it probably isn't fake, as many big news organizations try to check their sources before they publish a story.

#### 4. Look for other signs

There are other techniques that fake news uses. These include using ALL CAPS and lots of ads that pop up when you click on a link. Also, think about how the story makes you feel. If the news story makes you angry, it's probably designed to make you angry.

If you know these things about online news and can apply them in your everyday life, then you have the control over what to read, what to believe and most importantly what to share. If you find a news story that you know is fake, the most important thing is: don't share it! (British Council--LearnEnglish, *How to Stop Fake News*)
